I am sure our Auckland based folk are relieved to have reached Level 2 on the Covid-19 scale and can escape to the bush for a change of scenery. I understand a significant Auckland branch hunt just took place and that is great to see. Hopefully some people new to hunting got a great experience and were able to take in a bit of our culture as well.

The executive has met three times via Microsoft Teams this month to further our strategic planning and we are now in the final phase of that development. Looking forward, that will form the basis of what NZDA pursues as an organisation and will guide our CEO's planning and delivery. You will have also just received the latest NZ Hunting & Wildlife magazine with information on what political parties can offer in terms of policies around firearms and hunting resources.

Several items have come past us in the past month and we will work towards solutions with other parties to ensure the best outcomes are reached for recreational hunters. Everything from legislation around ranges and firearms ownership, game management, regional views and performance of DOC has been raised.

Specifically we are going to be approaching all branches and asking for two people from each branch to be involved in a national program of information gathering and reporting on the state of deer herds and their habitats. Further information will be provided as to how this will all work but some of you will be aware that Minister Sage has expressed her desire to see deer herds culled to protect forests. It is also one of our policies to participate in management of wild animals to ensure the habitat is adequately conserved. We cannot be remiss and ignore what we have signed up to. The failures of all parties with regard to management of our Tahr herd must not be repeated with our deer herds and while parts of the country are not suffering from too many animals, there are other parts where either deer numbers are high or there are other species in residence that are making it look like deer are responsible for degradation of forest environments. If we look to the Wapiti or Sika Foundation we can see what solutions look like but they are formed by local knowledge, experience, scientific guidance, cooperation and a willingness to do the work even if it means the hunting is a bit more challenging.

Silly spiker month is coming, get out and fill up the freezer with something good.


Long Service Badges can be ordered by branches for their members

NZ Police Update - Change of Address

As a firearms licence holder, you are required to notify the Police of any change to address or contact details in writing within 30 days.

Please remember to do so as this is a requirement by law.

- Follow the link https://forms.police.govt.nz/notification-change which will send you directly to Police website and change of address form or you can click on the links beneath the signature block.
- Call 105 the Police Non-Emergency line at any time or between the hours of 8am and 4pm, Monday to Friday to speak with a member of the Firearms National Support Team. They will assist you.
- If you do not wish to use the link, the online change of address form is found on the Police website:
 - 1. Go on the Police website and search for Change of address
 - 2. Choose Change of address and firearms issues
 - 3. Select Change of address
 - 4. Click on "Update your details online" element in blue
 - 5. Complete the form.




